DUTIES	<ol> <li>To remain up-to-date on all matters relating to the Cub Scout Section in the District, with particular regard to the obtaining of the educational objectives of the Section and to keep the District Commissioner advised on the same.</li> <li>To remain current with all aspects of life affecting young people aged 8 to 11 years in the Scout Movement both in Australia and overseas and the community generally.</li> <li>To provide enthusiastic, energetic leadership to the Cub Scout Section throughout the District, thus motivating Leaders to provide the Scout Section with Cub Scouts eager to advance to that Section.</li> <li>To encourage Leaders in the Cub Scout Section to implement an active, adventurous program that highlights and centres around youth activity and the Section objectives.</li> </ol>



## **GOLD COAST REGION**

- 5. To advise the District Commissioner and Assistant Region Commissioner (Cub Scouts) on Cub Scout Section matters.
- 6. Be responsible for resources material relating to the Cub Scout Section in the District newsletter and whatever other publications are appropriate.
- To encourage the planning and holding of regular Cub Scout Leader sessions at District Training Meetings, to supplement formal adult training given through the Adult Leader Training Scheme.
- To meet regularly with the Assistant Region Commissioner (Cub Scouts), visit Cub Scout meetings within the District, and meet with other District Leaders (Cub Scouts) where applicable.
- 9. Continue working to achieve the objectives relating to the Cub Scout Section in the Region and District Strategic Plans.
- Specifically promote the following Cub Scout Section development aspects; (1) youth membership recruitment and retention, (2) Youth Program effectiveness, relevance, and acceptability and (3) Leader's recruitment, retention, training and deployment.
- 11. To liaise with the Assistant Region Commissioner regarding support to the Cub Scout Award Scheme and in particular the introduction of a broad range of activities representing the interests and needs of young people today (consistent with the traditional activities of the Scout Movement) whilst ensuring a high, active participation by the membership.
- 12. To represent the District Commissioner as required.
- 13. To develop a possible successor for the role of District Leader (Cub Scouts).
- 14. Any other duties requested by and in support of the District Commissioner.
- 15. To plan and conduct District Cub Scout activities, for example, District Camps, Field Days etc.
- 16. Hold a Leader of Adults wood badge or be prepared to complete Leader of Adults training within 12 months of appointment.
